

The Prison Population in Denmark



- 5,8 million inhabitants in Denmark
- Prison capacity: 4.200
- Prison population: 3.700
 - Open prisons: 1100
 - Closed prisons: 900
 - Local prisons: 1700
- Prisoners convicted/on remand for terrorism: 22



Terrorist Attacks Before February 2015

- Terrorist attacks abroad: London, Madrid, Oslo/Utøya, Paris etc.
- Planned, but prevented, attacks in Denmark: Glasvej, Vollsmose, Jyllandsposten
- Increased level of threath following the cartoon crisis in 2005 and international military engagement



Attack in Copenhagen - February 2015

- Two attacks
- Against freedom of expression, and against the Jewish population
- Two civilians killed
- Six police officers and security agents wounded



Omar El-Hussein - Prison Background



- Extensive criminal background
- In the periphery of criminal gangs
- Signs of concern reported twice
- In remand for more than a year when released - 13 days before the shootings.

Foreign Fighters



- Departed since 2012: 150
- Returned: 50
- Currently 8 persons in prison
- Different backgrounds
- Some with a criminal history, some without
- Some with ties to gangs

- All game consoles were removed from all Danish prisons.




Reporting Concerns



- From 2015 onwards all concerns are sent to the Danish Security and Intelligence Service (PET)
- Concerns are validated, assessed and rated internally
- Proper responses and security measures applied according to the assessment.

Number of Reports







- Validation and security assessment
- Interviews
- Preventive action/security measures
- Mentoring schemes
- Sharing of assessment with concerns upon release.
